BookSmart event to discuss book on JFK

BookSmart Tulsa will host an event Wednesday featuring the authors of a new book on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Bill Minutaglio and Steven L. Davis will talk about their book "Dallas 1963" at 7 p.m. Wednesday at Gilcrease Museum, 1400 N. Gilcrease Museum Road. The event is free and open to the public.

"Dallas 1963" is less the story of the killing of a U.S. president as it is an examination of the political, social and racial attitudes that existed in Dallas in the time leading up to Nov. 22, 1963.

As the authors write: "The far right movement, divided and even marginalized toward the end of the Eisenhower administration, is suddenly bursting wide open in reaction to Kennedy's presidency. Membership in the John Birch Society skyrockets, and hundreds of other new organizations are springing up. The Minute-men preach armed resistance to the domestic communist takeover."

Many critics have praised the book, drawing parallels between the anti-Kennedy statements of his detractors in Texas with those made about President Barack Obama, but others have expressed concern over the book's one-sidedness.

In a review for the Dallas Morning News, University of Texas professor Don Graham, who teaches a course on the history of Kennedy's assassination, writes: "Minutaglio and Davis are like a team of U.N. inspectors visiting a country where buried canisters of noxious verbal gas have been left behind for a new generation to discover and, if they're of a sufficiently liberal mind, to savor how bad those days were, how much hatred



there was in Dallas. But the streets of the city that day in November were packed with thousands of people — estimates run to more than 100,000 — who didn't hate at all, who were excited to see the president and his beautiful wife and who lived in that other Dallas that nobody is much interested in."

Harry Levins, writing for the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, points out two problems with "Dallas 1963": "First, the authors end their book on Nov. 24, 1963, when assassin Lee Harvey Oswald is gunned down in a Dallas police station. The authors never return to Dallas to tell readers what the atmosphere feels like half a century later."

"And second, for all of the authors' hand-wringing about the far-right wing in Dallas, the shot that killed Kennedy in Dallas was fired by a left-wing zealot."

Dylan's guitar from Newport to be auctioned

NEW YORK — The sunburst Fender Stratocaster that a young Bob Dylan played at the 1965 Newport Folk Festival when he famously went electric is coming up for auction, where it could bring as much as half a million dollars.

Though now viewed as changing American music forever, Dylan's three-song electric set

at the Rhode Island festival that marked his move from acoustic folk to electric rock 'n' roll was met by boos from folk purists. He returned for an acoustic encore with "It's All Over Now, Baby Blue."

Now the guitar is being offered for sale Dec. 6, Christie's said. Five lots of hand- and type-written lyric fragments found

inside the guitar case — early versions of some of Dylan's legendary songs — also are being sold. The lyrics have a pre-sale estimate ranging from \$3,000 to \$30,000.

The lyrics for sale include "In the Darkness of Your Room," an early draft of "Absolutely Sweet Marie."
