The CSU, Chico, Human Identification Laboratory (CSU, Chico HIL) provides forensic anthropological services to law enforcement agencies and medical examiner's offices in California. The laboratory receives between 80 and 100 cases each year. Requests for anthropological analysis include pathological consultation, identification, and trauma analysis. The HIL team is also called out for outdoor searches, exhumations and scene recoveries approximately 20 times per year. Additionally, the HIL houses a stable isotope prep lab to process human and animal samples for paleodietary research. The department maintains four active laboratories: the Anthropology Media Lab, the Forensic Anthropology Lab, the California Coastal Archaeology Lab and the Mesoamerican Archaeology Lab. The department offers an Honors Program for qualified upper division students. The program is designed to introduce superior students to independent research and the writing of professional reports. Diplomas and transcripts of Honors Program graduates are designated: "Graduated with Departmental Honors in Anthropology."
