Headlice

There have been many reports recently of head lice. Please take the time to check your children/s hair for live lice and eggs. If you find head lice, treatment must be started before your children return to school. There are many types of treatment available for purchase, but please remember that unless you are diligent in combing out the eggs, the lice will hatch and begin the cycle all over again.

To try and prevent children contracting head lice, students are reminded to have their hair tied up at all times. Regular hair brushing also reduces head lice as any live lice combed by a hair brush can have their legs broken, stopping them from moving about the hair.

ROAD SAFETY – KEEP YOUR KIDS SAFE IN TRAFFIC

Pedestrian safety signs, signals, rules and behaviour—below are some RULES

Jaywalking

The law says you must cross by the shortest safe route and not stay on the road longer than needed to cross safely.

Railway Crossings

A pedestrian cannot cross a railway line at a level crossing if there is a path, bridge or other structure designed for the use of pedestrians within 20 metres of the crossing.

Give way to pedestrians

Drivers are required by law to give way to pedestrians crossing the road that the vehicle is turning into.

Drivers and crosswalks

Drivers are required by law to give way to pedestrians using a cross walk or children's crossing. Remember, some vehicles do not always stop.

Driveways and laneways

Drivers are required by law to give way to pedestrians on the footpath.

Pedestrian, crosswalks and traffic lights

The law says if you are within 20 metres of a crosswalk or traffic light you must use it to cross the road.
