What is the matter with Shakespeare's families? Why do so many of his tragic plays involve injuries and betrayals committed between parents and children, husbands and wives, sisters and brothers? How do these plays respond to changes in the understanding and organization of the family during the English Renaissance? Works by Shakespeare and other Renaissance writers rarely provide a straightforward expression of either older or newer beliefs about the family and marriage. What their texts can show us, instead, are the conflicts and contradictions that emerged as writers examined family relationships during this period. Renaissance records of Shakespeare's plays in performance are scarce, but a detailed account of an original production of *Macbeth* has survived, thanks to Dr. Simon Forman. Earliest known text: First Folio (1623). *Othello* (1604-1605) *Othello*, a valiant Moorish general in the service of Venice, falls prey to the devious schemes of his false friend, Iago. Earliest known text: Quarto (1622). The sweet whispers shared by young Tudor lovers throughout the realm were often referred to as "naught but pure *Romeo and Juliet*." Earliest known text: Quarto (1597). *Timon of Athens* (1607-1608) Written late in Shakespeare's career, *Timon of Athens* is criticized as an underdeveloped tragedy, likely co-written by George Wilkins or Cyril Tourneur. A Midsummer's Night Dream, comedy in five acts by William Shakespeare, written about 1595-96. Noting that the human lovers in the forest are also at odds, he orders Puck to drop the love juice into Demetrius's eyes so that Demetrius's one-time affection for Helena will be restored. Because the two young Athenian men look much alike, however, Puck mistakenly administers the love juice to Lysander, who then happens to see Helena when he awakes. Shakespeare's plays have traditionally been classified as "tragedies," "histories" or "comedies" but as time went by and scholars began to regard him as the greatest English writer of all times, his plays were studied more carefully by academics, researchers and critics. The plays also feature the re-unification of divided families. Whereas in comedies there is a happy ending where all the characters are paired off in love and happiness, there are pairings and happy endings in the romance plays but always with the dark shadows cast by the unpleasant events that lurk in everyone's memory.
