Granting women political rights was intended to bring more women westward and to boost the population. Others suggest that women had long played nontraditional roles on the hardscrabble frontier and were accorded a more equal status by men. Still others find that political expediency by territorial officials played a role. Women's history has come a long way. Some twenty years ago, Gerda Lerner wrote that "the striking fact about the historiography of women is the general neglect of the subject by historians".¹ Historical scholarship was far from "objective" or "universal", because it was based on male experience, placed men at the centre and as a measure of all things human, thereby leaving out half of humankind. In the past two decades, the situation has changed considerably. In an enormous (and enormously growing) body of scholarship women have been rendered visible.Â
