SELECTED BIBLIOGRAPHY

As much as possible, works have been grouped by topic. With the exception of “General” (broad coverage) and “Various” (specific focus) categories, topics are listed in alphabetical order. Items listed in the “General” and “Various” categories commonly contain information on more than one topic. Hence, these sections should be consulted for material on any topic.

All works are in the Perry-Castaneda Library unless specified otherwise.

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Formatting your bibliography While notes and bibliographies contain much of the same information, bibliographic form differs from note form in these ways: i, Notes are numbered; bibliographies are alphabetized. The author's last name appears first (Smith, Betty) in a bibliography. Nancy Rose. diss. Congressional Record. Quoted in Bonnie Costello. and Pamela Oliver. A Book Forged in Hell: Spinoza's Scandalous Treatise and the Birth of the Secular Age. Steven. Purity in Print: Book Censorship in America from the Gilded Age to the Computer Age. director. Documents Similar To Bibliography. The seminar will meet only a few times during this period. Beginning in March, students will begin presenting their research findings to the seminar and submitting their final papers. The aim of this course is for students to develop their own opinions on just what the impact of the automobile has been on life in Canada, and within a North American context. the development of. documents discussed in readings and explain their significance. potential implications and significance for the field , refining it to a significant and answerable. Any reviews you consult should be fully documented with footnotes and a bibliography.
