Section 1 of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms is the section that confirms that the rights listed in the Charter are guaranteed. The section is also known as the reasonable limits clause or limitations clause, as it legally allows the government to limit an individual's Charter rights. This limitation on rights has been used in the last twenty years to prevent a variety of objectionable conduct such as hate speech (e.g., in *R v Keegstra*) and obscenity (e.g., in *R v Butler*). Growing up in Jacksonville, Fla., Rhonda Britton experienced occasional moments of racism. As the only black girl in her junior-high class, she was once told by a white friend that she wasn't allowed to come over and play. But it was when she moved to Canada as an adult that she felt racism more overtly: In 2011, she discovered a historic plaque in front of her church in Halifax spray painted with the words: Fuck All Niggers. One in five have had racist remarks directed at them. And more than a third said they have made a racist remark in the company of others. The poll, conducted in April and May of this year, has a silver lining: Eight in 10 Canadians believe it's possible to educate people to make them less racist in their attitudes.
